







Daily Maintanance

- Dust or sweep regularly to prevent dirt and grit from scratching the surface.
- Wipe spills immediately, especially acidic substances (e.g., lemon juice, vinegar, wine, coffee).
- Use a soft cloth or microfiber mop for dry cleaning and dusting.
- Use coasters and mats under glasses, bottles, and hot dishes.

Sealing

Marble is porous, so sealing is essential to protect from stains.

- Initial sealing should be done during or just after installation.
- Reseal frequency:
 - Every 6–12 months for kitchen countertops or high-traffic areas.
 - Annually or bi-annually for flooring, depending on use and product type.
- Test with water: if water darkens the marble, it's time to reseal.
- Use a penetrating (impregnating) sealer made for natural stone.

Cleanning

- Use a pH-neutral stone cleaner or a mild dish soap diluted with water.
- Avoid:
 - Acidic or alkaline cleaners (e.g., vinegar, bleach, ammonia).
 - Abrasive pads, scouring powders, or rough cloths.
- For tougher stains:
 - Use a poultice paste specifically designed for marble.
 - Consult a stone care professional for deep etching or staining.
- Dry surfaces after cleaning to prevent water spots.
